

The Fourth Edition of VAPOR TRAILS looks like any other high school annual, whether it is a product of the sophisticated East, the pinescented North, the sunny South, or the open spaces of America's great West. And that is as it should be, for the yearbook staffs of our eight United States Air Force schools overseas are Wisconsinites, New Yorkers, Georgians and Californians — some of us from farms, some of us from small villages, some of us from our country's great urban centers. Our schools look like any good American high schools; our teachers are Americans, following the same educational methods as any American teachers.

Walk into one of our high schools and you walk into America! Visit an English class and, like all America's high school English classes, it will be staring meekly at noun clauses or delving into the twisted psychology of "Silas Marner". Visit a math class and find the square on the hypotenuse of a right triangle, or the locus of a point, carrying on business as usual. Our science laboratories work in the practical American way, whether the subject is biology, chemistry or physics. Our historians study the whole world, and still give special attention to our own country. In this book you will also find evidence of typical American high school activities: pictures of clubs, games, cheer-leading, parties and plays like all of such pictures in all of America's high school yearbooks. Our cafeterias serve the same menus. Our assemblies serve up the same programs. All the same, VAPOR TRAILS shows the background as well as the foreground. And if the foreground is always the same, the background is always different. Ankara, Bitburg, London, Chateauroux, Izmir, Casablanca, Tripoli, Wiesbaden — they color our lives as we work and play. Some of us look from our classroom windows at old Roman arches, at Moslem minarets, at Gothic chateaux, at Norman cathedrals or at mediaeval castles or cottages. For some of us our only Christmas tree is an orange-tasseled palm; for others Christmas is knee-deep in diamond-bright snow crystals and the yule-log burns for nearly a week!

Nor is it only the background that makes our life different. No one can imagine the way people of other lands feel and think; unless he himself has lived in that land, eaten food from its markets, made friends with its people and exchanged ideas about everything with them. Because we have done all this, we like to believe that, as adults, we shall be more understanding in our dealings with other lands. We know how the Oriental feels about "saving face". Why the German takes even his smallest children with him to the beer-garden. Why every Viennese dentist plays the cello so beautifully. What the giving of bread and salt means to an Arabian host. Why the English feel so passionately that the milk must go into the cup before the tea does. We have learned not to irritate small prejudices and how to honor deep feelings. Best of all, our friends have taught us to see our own prejudices and deep feelings with a more objective eye. Lest we forget such lessons we have only to turn these pages again to remember. A strange and different year of our lives is crowded into these pages. That is why one of the most cherished mementos of our youth must be VAPOR TRAILS.




SCHOOL HISTORY

- 1529 Henry VIII establishes the Royal Deer Park of Hampton Court Palace in the area now known as Bushy Park Air Force Base.
- 1942 The United States Eighth Air Force sets up headquarters in "A" Block.
- 1944 General Dwight D. Eisenhower, Supreme Commander of the Allied Expeditionary Forces, establishes his SHAEF headquarters in "C" and "D" blocks.
- 1945 Nazi bombers list Bushy as number two priority target, "out-ranked" only by the Houses of Parliament.
- 1946 VIP's visiting Bushy include King George VI; Prime Minister Churchill; Field Marshal Lord Montgomery; Lord Tedder; and Generals Spaatz, Patton, and De Gaulle.
- 1952 "B" and "C" Blocks are turned into a Dependents' School. Central High is born.
- 1953 Enrollment rises to 250. Halls are crowded.
- 1959 Enrollment hits all-time high of 900.


