The London papers picked up on the story and it was splashed all over the newsstands the next day with huge pictures of the wedding party, including Betsy who was her older sister's Maid of Honor.

I was his date for the wedding and we wrote to each other for some time after that. Since I was planning a career in theatre, Mike could very well have been remembering me. I was at Bushy Park from November 1954 until late October 1955, most of my junior year and the beginning of my senior year. I left suddenly and in a state of shock when my Mom was killed in a car accident a month after my 17th birthday in October 1955.

I believe that many of my memories of my time there were affected by the trauma of my Mom's death and the fact that I had to leave without saying goodbye to my friends there. Although I have been able to look at the Yearbook and other photos on the web, I have a problem remembering many of the people who were my closest friends. I do have very happy memories of Coach Cannon, both as a Coach and History Teacher, and of the basketball team and cheerleaders, especially our trip to the season ending tournament in Frankfort, Germany. I remember the long bus rides from Lakenheath/Mildenhall, the good times in the dorm (both the boys and girls), bad meals in the cafeteria (I still don't like

shepherd's pie), weekends in Bovingdon, train rides from Teddington to London, a great prom with a big band at a posh hotel in London. Maybe I remember more than I think I do. What a fabulous experience for a high school student...things I learned there helped me many times later in my life.

I can't thank you enough, and those who help you, for the service you provide to all of us who were lucky enough to have been students at Bushy Park. I've enjoyed reading each and every newsletter and look forward to more in the future.

A very nice lady called me from the archive office of Bushy Park. I told her about your interest in where the air force base used to be and your school. In 1942 when the ground was given over to the Air Force an agreement was signed that when it was no longer required that it would revert back to Parkland. In 1962 the whole base was razed to the ground in accordance with the agreement but to an

outcry from local people who would have been able to benefit from the good facilities that were there. The site was reached by going in the main gates and turning left. Or going through the gates opposite an entrance to Hampton Court and going all the way down the avenue almost to the end and turning right. There is now a memorial gate there. There are other memorial plaques in the grass indicating the corner of a particular building etc. A small archive has been put together and is mainly items and news cuttings that have been donated.
