For any of my CHS '61 classmates who believe that I am no longer among the living, herewith is a photo of me alive and well accompanied by my sweet wife Julie. It was taken last month by the club photographer at the Army Navy Club of Washington, D.C. The occasion was a Dining Out. It was the first one I've attended in nearly a half century. And it's the first one Julie ever attended.



She thought the rituals and traditions were a blast. There was a lively exchange of funny insults between the Army and Navy but hardly any from the USAF and USMC attendees.



My table mates were a combination of retired officers, each of whom had rich careers (and all of whom out ranked me). It was a fun evening. We broke the ice by sharing stories about the Dining Outs and Dining Ins we attended when we were young officers.

However, we gave table bragging rights to the USAF retired colonel who wore his circa 1968 Dress

Mess uniform. It turned out this colonel and I served in Vietnam at the same time. He was a B-52 navigator who flew over the north, while I was a C-123 transport pilot who flew throughout the south. Coincidentally, the day before, he retired from NSA. His total combined Federal service was an astounding 61 years!

Behind me is a genuine Frederick Remington bronze. One identical to it sold recently for a cool quarter million. The Army Navy Club (ANC) has several Remington bronzes. However, its paintings and military memorabilia are the most valuable part of its art collection.
