Charles Hal Dayhuff, III - October 8, 1939 - January 1, 2018

Mr. Charles Hal Dayhuff, III, age 80, of Griffin, passed away January 1, 2018. He was born in Rochester, Indiana, son of the late Charles Hal Dayhuff, Jr. and Marian Weaver Perry Dayhuff. He was a graduate of the Virginia Military Institute in Lexington, Virginia, and a veteran of the United States Army Infantry, serving in the Vietnam War and retiring as a Lieutenant Colonel. Mr. Dayhuff then worked as a Mortgage Broker. He was an active member of Life Springs United Methodist Church. As of 2015, he was a 70-year member of the Boy Scouts of American and former Eagle Scout and Silver Beaver, receiving the La Orden De Espiritu De Las Buenas Obras (highest Scouting award in Panama Canal Zone). He was a member of the Atlanta Vietnam Veterans Association, the American Legion Post #197 in Pike County, the Military Order of World Wars, the Veteran of Foreign Wars - Alpharetta Post #12002 and the Old Guard of the Gate City Guard of Atlanta. Mr. Dayhuff was a former President of the Buckhead Fifty in Atlanta, former President of Isthmus Toastmasters and Past State President of the Georgia Society Sons of the American Revolution. He was also a member of the Sons of the American Revolution; First Families of Maryland; First Families Indiana Pioneers, Sons and Daughters of the Pilgrims; Sons of Indian Wars; Constables and High Sheriff's; Sons of Union Veterans; Sons and Daughters of World War II Veterans; Sons of the Revolution; Ark and Dove Society; Friends of the Georgia Archives; Pike County Historical Society and a Kentucky Colonel. Mr. Dayhuff received the Roger Sherman Medal-SAR-Service of Excellence, The General William C. Westmoreland Award-Veteran Volunteer for SAR, SAR/CAR Silver Medal of Appreciation and the SAR-War Service Medal-Vietnam.

With help from friends in Concord, he and his wife Barbara formed the first Concord Country Jubilee in 1975, and they chaired this position for the first several years. The Jubilee was created to raise money for a new fire truck.

He is survived by his wife of 51 years: Barbara Angeline Slade Cribb Dayhuff; sons: Richard Edward Cribb Dayhuff and wife Pam, and Charles Hal Dayhuff IV and wife Latrelle; daughter: Martha Claire (Cribb) Dayhuff Rhodes and husband Wiley; eleven grandchildren and nine great-grandchildren; sisters: Marian Alicia Dayhuff Dorsie and her husband Joe Dorsie, and the late Jane Duke Dayhuff Collins and her husband Ronald Wayne Collins.

A memorial service for Mr. and Mrs. Dayhuff was held on Saturday, January 20, at Fincher Chapel of Life Springs, 11033 Hwy. 109, Meansville, GA 30256. Pastor Alex Smith officiated.

Dear Friends:

It is with the greatest sadness that we have to announce that our mother, Martha Gail Kelly, has passed away today 16 April 2018 in London.

She was 92 years old – on this very day – and passed away in the mid-afternoon. Her sons Duff and Jesse and grandson Cameron along with long-time friends and helpers Norma and Maria and family friend Judy were with her at the end.

It has always been an honour to be her sons and an honour for us to know how many of you also cherished her wisdom, wit and also, her positive 'can do' approach to life.

Gail, as many of you knew her, was born in 1926 and grew up in Santa Monica, California, the youngest of six kids in the Rochlen Family – three boys and three girls – who all managed to make it through WWII. She had worked part-time as a newspaper gossip columnist as a youngster, but it was while working at Santa Monica Post Office, she met our father, Francis Robert Kelly.

A few years after WWII ended, he received the GI Bill to study art in France and they bravely set sail – thus beginning a life-long adventure that took them far away from family and country of birth. They went first to Paris in 1951, then, after time back in the US, to London as part of a Fulbright Scholarship in 1955 – where they stayed, made a home and raised a family of three boys and later became grandparents to Cameron, Erin and Caitlin.

Her wider family including nephew Peter Greenberg, niece Karen Greenberg and Karen's husband Richard Rudman and nephew Pua Rochlen and his wife, Heather, and so many other extended family have lead the way in reflecting the great positivity their aunt generated.

Those of you who knew her as a colleague, teacher or coach with the Department of Defense dependent schools where she worked for the 30 years from 1956-1986 will know of her dedication to her job. First at Eastcote and then at the three 'homes' of London Central High School (at American Air Force bases at Bushy Park, Bushey Hall and High Wycombe). We hope you will remember her for her belief in the greatness of every child she taught or coached. She loved to coach her Volleyball and Track. She took an interest in everyone...and that was a secret to who she was.

Over the years we have all taken great pride in the lovely words written and spoken in person by so many of her students who contacted or visited and their children and their children's children!

So many of you have written such warm words – she really did get to see and hear all of those messages right up to the end. She was honoured but always credited the person who had written for their own insight and self-belief.

We want to thank all of you who have been her great friends, neighbours, colleagues and companions. She really cherished those relationships.

In accordance with our mother's very specific wishes there will be no funeral or memorial service. She would not want you to waste a second of your own precious lives on her but, rather, enjoy your lives and live them to the fullest. Nothing would please or honor her more than to think of you enjoying your favorite sports and activities, or spending quality time with your families. If you feel you must do something more, mother received wonderful support from the Admiral Nurses who helped her care for dad in his final years. As with our father, that journey with Gail has now come to an inevitable end, but we'd like to think her words, and love and innate ability to continue to uplift people will live on in the memories and actions of all who met her. We're closing with a line from our brother Duff who wrote this on the occasion of her 90th birthday.

"No greater fortune was ever afforded a child than to have been born to this lovely woman!"
