

He coached children's soccer, little league, and Challenger Little League.

He was known for his exceptional intellect, impeccable integrity, and dry wit. Family was the center of his life, especially his sons, Josh, Ben, and Sam, who survive him. He is also survived by his sister Karen, her husband Jeff, their four daughters and grandchildren; and by Ben's beloved

wife Jenna and their daughters Sarah and Hailey. (Papa thought grandkids were the best.) His parents preceded him in death.





To all London Central High School Alumni

This year, 2024, marks 60 years since the graduating Seniors of the Class of 1964 walked across the stage at the Bushey Town Hall to get their diplomas. To help us celebrate this milestone event, a reunion for the Class of '64 & Friends (62's, 63's, 65's, 66's) has been organized for **Oct. 4-6, 2024, in San Antonio, Texas**, at the historic **Menger Hotel** which is located downtown, across from the Alamo. The group rate is \$165 a night. The Menger is also just blocks from the famed San Antonio River Walk, the River Center Shopping Mall and of course, the incredible three-block San Antonio Market Square with its famous El Mercado Mexican markets. Links to the Menger Hotel Reservations & Website, the famed River Walk and Market Square are included at the end of this email.

When the seed was planted in my head in late 1987 to organize and hold a London Central High School reunion, I targeted the 1962 to 1966 class years, which included our Class of '64 of course, but since so many had siblings in the years just behind us and a couple of years ahead of us, those were the years I would search for. In the beginning, I only had one name. Phil Souza. I knew where his parents lived in Modesto, CA and they were easy to find in a phonebook. Then countless hours were spent at the Houston Library downtown pouring over nationwide phone books on microfiche looking for classmates themselves - or relatives. The list of "found" Bobcats started to grow. The second week in July 1988 was chosen as the date for the event and a hotel was booked. But I started getting calls from other former students who heard about the reunion and said, of course, they would be more than welcome to come as well. It turned out that everyone knew where one or two other classmates were and many parents stayed in touch with each other and had their kids' contact information so the list really begun to swell. Then I started to locate teachers and staff members from the school. At some point, this turned into an All Class, Grand Reunion and had swelled to the point that it became the largest reunion ever held for the Dept. of Defense Overseas School System. A record that I think stands to this day. At final count, we had just under 1,000 former students attend and 47 former teachers and their spouses.

Ron Crowe and I have teamed up to reach out to everyone on his email list to encourage them to come to San Antonio and help recreate the magic of the Mighty Mighty Bobcats from the 1960's. Attached to this email is an Excel spreadsheet with the names and email addresses of those on the current mailing list but we know that there are many names from the class years on either side of us who are not included. We're hoping that many of you can help fill in those we're missing so we can get the reunion invitation out to them as well. So please, please, please – if you have contact information for those from the years on either side of '64 (and even Class of 64 alumni that might be missing), get those names and contact information to Ron or myself so we can include them in this memory-making event. For those of you who came to Houston in 1988, the attached photos will being those memories flooding back in. This October will be a great opportunity to recreate some of that magic with those who shared the incredible experience of going to high school in London.


